### State-by-State Legislation/Regulation as of June 2023

- **Alaska:** No prohibitions on hemp use in animal feed.
- **California:** AB45 (2021)(passed) permits pet food and treats to contain hemp extract.
- **Kansas:** HB2168 (2023)(introduced), which would permit the use of hemp fiber, grain, and seeds in feed for livestock, poultry, and pets.
- **Montana:** HB0396 (2021)(passed) allows naturally occurring plant material, including hemp, to be used in feed for various animals.
- **Nevada:** AB101 (2021)(passed) allows veterinarians to prescribe CBD products for animals.
- **New Jersey:** Allows hemp products for both human and animal consumption.
- **Ohio:** Allows hemp products for both human and animal consumption.
- **Oklahoma:** HB349 (2022)(passed) allows hemp grain and its derivatives for livestock feed.
- **Texas:**
  - Feed Industry Memos 5-36 (2023) and 5-35 (2023) issue guidance to allow hemp seed meal as a commercial feed ingredient for horses and chickens.
- **Virginia:** Allows hemp products for both human and animal consumption.
- **West Virginia:** Allows hemp products for both human and animal consumption.
